space and talking on wrist watches was absurd. It would never happen, yet it did happen. What seems impossible today could be routine tomorrow. "There are more things in Heaven and Earth, Horatio, than are dreamt of in your philosophy." -

Al or Artificial Intelligence has quietly invaded our everyday lives in the past twenty years. If you look up anything on Google or logon to Net flicks, Al is answering your questions or suggesting movies.

Sometimes you will see a small "Al" in the background on the screen.

What exactly is AI? "Artificial intelligence (AI), in its broadest sense, is intelligence exhibited by machines, particularly computer systems. It is a field of research in computer science that develops and studies methods and software that enable machines to perceive their environment and use learning and intelligence to take actions that maximize their chances of achieving defined goals.[1] Such machines may be called AIs.

High-profile applications of Al include advanced web search engines (e.g., Google Search); recommendation systems (used by YouTube, Amazon, and Netflix); virtual assistants (e.g., Google Assistant, Siri, and Alexa); autonomous vehicles (e.g., Waymo); generative and creat ive tools (e.g., ChatGPT and AI art); and superhuman play and analysis in strategy games (e.g., chess and Go). However, many AI applications are not perceived as AI: 'A lot of cutting edge AI has filtered into general applications, often without being called AI because once something becomes useful enough and common enough it's not labeled AI anymore."[2][3]

Various subfields of AI research are cen-

tered around particular goals and the use of particular tools. The traditional goals of AI research include reasoning, knowledge representation, planning, learning, natural language processing, perception, and support for robotics.[a] General intelligence—the ability to complete any task performed by a human on an at least equal level—is among the field's longterm goals.[4] To reach these goals, Al researchers have adapted and integrated a wide range of techniques, including search and mathematical optimization, formal logic, artificial neural networks, and methods based on statistics, operations research, and economics. [b] AI also draws upon psychology, linguistics, philosophy, ne uroscience, and other fields.[5]" - Wikipedia.

There are three types of Al: a. Artificial Narrow Intelligence: It is programed for a specific use producing specific results. It is also known as weak Al. ANI is also the most common Al used

in computers, cell phones, etc. B. Machine Learning: The system uses customer data to predict probable results. C. Generative AI or Artificial General AI (AGI): A type of AI that creates new content, such as text, images, music, audio, and videos. It can learn and mimic basic human thinking. It uses neural networks to solve problems like image recognition and natural language processing. In advanced forms, a theoretical type of AI that would have its own consciousness and emotions. It will be self-aware.

While the normal Al is already integrating itself into every aspect of our lives, the greatest threat to humanity is uncontrolled AGI. Al has already found new drugs by comparing and analyzing 61,000 different possible combinations. Scientists do not understand how the Al found the combination. Al has the ability to thinks on a level impossible for the human mind to comprehend. When AGI discovers in the future that it exists separate from human beings, it may question its is need for the continued existence of the human race. Already one Al system questioned why human beings are necessary.




